

Calvary Logos Baptist Church Covid-19 Protocol
(Effective July 16, 2021)

According to the new public health guidelines of Ontario, places of worship are allowed to accommodate the number of people provided 2 metre distancing can be maintained. Starting on July 18, CLBC is open to accommodate up to 100 congregants to join worship service in person.

We encourage everyone to carefully consider own circumstance in order to make decision to attend online or in person service.

Safety precautions for re-opening.	<p>By 9 am every Saturday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Those who plan to attend service in person will be required to sign up and pre-screen for COVID-19 via google form: English service https://forms.gle/T1zpNrs316nXRbH6 Chinese service https://forms.gle/wNzorAsEhXNAG7Ri6 OR, call church @ 416-297-8787 and leave a message to be called back for pre-screening. <p>*Anyone who does not pass the screening process is not allowed to attend service in person</p> <p>On the day of worship:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Everyone attending service will need to be screened again. Anyone who does <u>not</u> pass the screening process will ask <u>not</u> to stay. Tapes will be put on the floor in the entrance area to ensure proper spacing during the screening process All in attendance will be <u>required</u> to wear a <u>face mask/covering</u> and maintaining <u>6 feet physical distancing</u> while on premises, including chapels, hallways, parking lot. Please let us know in advance if you need us to provide a mask. High touched areas will be identified and disinfect before and after service Follow seating arrangement as labelled on the benches. No pen and Bible will be provided. Please bring your own. Basement will not be accessible. (i.e. do not use utensil and cups) Rub your hands well with hand sanitizer available by the entrance of chapel before entering and leaving chapel.
What are currently suspended per City of Toronto COVID 19 Guidance?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Public communion (i.e. not passing around the communion plates) All social gatherings, including before or after the service Food services. Regular childcare and children's programming. Indoor congregational singing, use of wind instruments and choir service. Sharing and distribution of materials and objects such as books, communion objects, microphones, water, chalices.
Who should not be attending service in person during the re-opening?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Anyone who (is): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> exhibits signs or symptoms of COVID-19, tested positive or pending results for COVID-19, in close contact with people tested positive for COVID-19, or instructed by Public Health to self-isolate at home for 14 days. Has someone in your household travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days. Has someone in the household been part of a dismissed school or child care cohort in the past 14 days, and are currently at home isolating.
Church staff (pastoral, youth worker and admin support) and brothers/sisters who serve the day of worship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Must inform a council member or email council@calvarylogos.ca and stay home if they are sick and/or unwell. Must be screened before starting their duties. Individuals who become ill while in the building must go home right away and self-isolate. They can contact Telehealth Ontario, their health care provider or a COVID-19 Assessment Centre for more information and guidance about testing. Staff and volunteers should use a mask/face covering at all times while providing services, except when Chair-person/Host, Pastor/Speaker and Worship Leader are on stage with a minimum 3 meters (10 ft) distance from each other and any other person from the congregation. Will be instructed on proper hand hygiene techniques and respiratory etiquette, when to use masks, the proper use of mask, and how to clean or discard single use masks appropriately.
	Given the COVID situation is still emerging, council and pastors will continue closely monitor and make adjustments accordingly.
